^{7 &}quot;Family households" consist of a householder and one or more other people related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. They do not include same-sex marriage couples even if the marriage was performed in a state issuing marriage certificates for same-sex couples. Same-sex couple households are included in the family households category if there is at least one additional person related to the householder by birth or adoption. Same-sex couple households with no relatives of the householder present are tabulated in nonfamily households. "Nonfamily households" consist of people living alone and households which do not have any members related to the householder.

⁸ Husband-Wife Family was categorized as Married-Couple Family in the 2000 Census, but was defined exactly the same.

⁹ For the 2000 Census, Rented or sold, not occupied was classified as one category, unlike the 2010 Census, in which it was classified into two separate categories.

¹⁰ Homeowner Vacancy Rate and Rental Vacancy Rate are not available due to a change in the classification of the sold and rented but not occupied categories, leaving the rates not comparable between the 2000 and 2010 Censuses.
